- **Foster ground breaking IS research to improve the quality of life in the Mediterranean Region** through further development of the regional knowledgebase and its emerging collaboration infrastructure,
- **Raise the visibility** of IS-related research, education, policy, and practice carried out in the Mediterranean Region

Scope

The organizers of MCIS 2010 aspire to bring together researchers, educators, policy makers and practitioners from the region for a high quality IS conference with solid academic and practitioner foundations.

Conference Submissions

The conference invites submissions on a broad range of IS themes relevant to IS research and education. Submissions with a focus on policy and practice in the Mediterranean region are especially welcome.

Journal Outlets

Selected papers will be considered for publication by a number of academic publications (e.g., IJDAR, IJESMA, BISe). Agreements with the editors are in progress and more information will be available soon.

Themes and Tracks

The conference invites topic proposals for a broad range of themes. At this time, chairs have been assigned to the tracks: Health Informatics, Human Computer Interaction Information, Information Economics and Business, Information Systems Development, Social Web, Recommender Systems, Requirement Engineering, Mobile Communications, e-Government Interoperability, Knowledge Sharing Technologies in Democratic Processes, Business Process Management, IT for Disaster Management.

MCIS2010 solicits the following types of contributions in English:

- Full research papers (7–12 pages)
- Extended abstracts and short research-in-progress papers (3–7 pages)
- Research and Teaching Case studies (7–12 pages)
- Panel/Workshop proposals (2–3 pages)
- Research statements from junior faculty members for the Junior Faculty and Doctoral Students Workshop (3–7 pages)
- Doctoral research proposals from PhD candidates for the Junior Faculty and Doctoral Students Workshop (7–12 pages)

Important Due Dates

- Deadline for all submissions: **May 1, 2010**
- Notification of acceptance: **July 1, 2010**
- Camera-ready versions: **July 15, 2010**

Proceedings: Conference Proceedings will be published online. An ISBN will be obtained, and the proceedings will be listed in major citation databases such as EBSCO, ABSInform, etc.
